
The RM of Edenwold had a great year in 2024, thanks to hard work and a solid plan to improve communication and teamwork between departments.

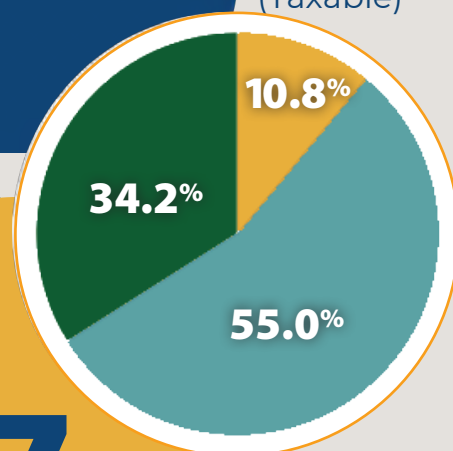

COLLABORATIVE COMMUNITY-BUILDER AND REGIONAL PARTNER

OUTCOME: The RM of Edenwold is a regional leader. Working together, the RM partners on strategic ventures for shared investment and benefit so our communities can thrive. The RM's strong and effective working relationships with urban and rural centres, neighbouring municipalities, and First Nations and Metis Nations support key regional priorities.

2024 HIGHLIGHTS:



The Saskatchewan Court of Appeal confirmed the Saskatchewan Municipal Board (SMB) decision to reject the Municipal Boundary Alteration Application by White City for almost 4,000 acres of RM land, including all of Emerald Park.



To improve municipal governance, both Council and Administration actively participated in workshops with other municipalities, gaining valuable insights and best practices. Additionally, we maintained frequent communication with neighbouring municipalities, fostering collaboration and mutual support.



The RM led a regional campaign to encourage sign-ups to the mass notification system also being used in Balgonie, Pilot Butte and White City. Voyent Alert! ensures timely and crucial communications on emergencies for all citizens in the region by allowing users to follow multiple municipalities on one simple app.



Collaborated with Cornerstone Credit Union at the Fired Up! Classic Car show on a BBQ with all proceeds supporting the White City Emerald Park Business Association scholarships for area students graduating from grade 12 and enrolling in post-secondary education.



Completed a joint project with the Town of White City along White City Drive for improved traffic and pedestrian pathway lighting.



Promoting road safety, Community Safety Officers conducted school tours during Canada Road Safety Week and safely guided school bike tours from Pilot Butte to White Butte trails.



ECONOMIC DIVERSITY & PROSPERITY

OUTCOME: The RM of Edenwold is a thriving and economically diverse business, agriculture, commercial, and industrial hub that drives regional prosperity and resiliency. The RM's effective economic and development practices are reflected in the successful relationships it nurtures with its people, organizations, and business community.

2024 HIGHLIGHTS:

-  Supporting continued growth, the RM issued 110 business licenses, 143 development permits, and 97 building permits. The RM also approved 19 subdivision applications.
-  The RM Council approved a new Development Levy Bylaw. This bylaw enables fees to be charged to new development that fund capital costs resulting from growth and development, supporting a "growth pays for growth" model.
-  The RM prepared updates to the Building Bylaw. Major changes include being able to register any building orders on the property title of the property, plus adding a performance deposit on commercial/industrial building permits for new buildings. Approval is expected in 2025.
-  The Annual Household Hazardous Waste Day in September allowed residents to properly discard their hazardous household waste in an environmentally safe manner.
-  Supporting the local community's recreational offerings, the RM continued to provide tax abatements to recreational businesses, such as Aspen Links, Green Acres, and Communiskate.

In May 2024, the RM proudly supported the construction of the new zero-depth beach entry pool in Balgonie that will offer recreational opportunities for people from the surrounding communities. The pool is scheduled to be completed in the summer of 2025.

The RM maintains two tax exemption programs. These programs can reduce your municipal taxes for a set period. One program is available for residential infill development, while the other supports commercial and industrial development.



Projects underway in 2024 included a pavement upgrade on South Service Road, microsurfacing treatment in the Stone Pointe Subdivision, and asphalt overlays in Rock Pointe Estates and the Park Crescent area.



Clay Capping was completed on the Balgonie Grid (622) from the Balgonie Overpass to Highway 48.



The RM undertook gravel extraction and crushing to provide for road maintenance, hauling, and spreading over 30,000 cubic yards of gravel on municipal roads.



The RM also invested in water, sewer and bridge repair projects.



The RM continued the Green Fund program offering up to \$2,000 for landscaping improvements to commercial and industrial businesses, to help beautify the area.



LIVABLE COMMUNITY

OUTCOME: The RM of Edenwold is a complete and vibrant community with a full range of services to meet the municipality's needs and beyond. We have a range of housing and lifestyle options, employment, recreation, and leisure opportunities that make our community a highly desirable place to live.

2024 HIGHLIGHTS:



All social media platforms experienced new followers with the most popular format, Facebook growing by 17% to 3,411 followers (Instagram rose by 8% and X/Twitter expanded by 4%).



The RM sought ratepayer feedback from the Community Satisfaction Survey in May 2024 to gather feedback on the state of RM services and governance. Survey results showed that 85% considered the Council and leadership as 'good to excellent' in terms of being qualified and respected.



The RM is viewed as safe and secure with 98% of respondents rating the municipality as 'good or excellent'. The Community Safety Officer Program rose from 76% satisfaction in 2023 to 84.5% in 2024.



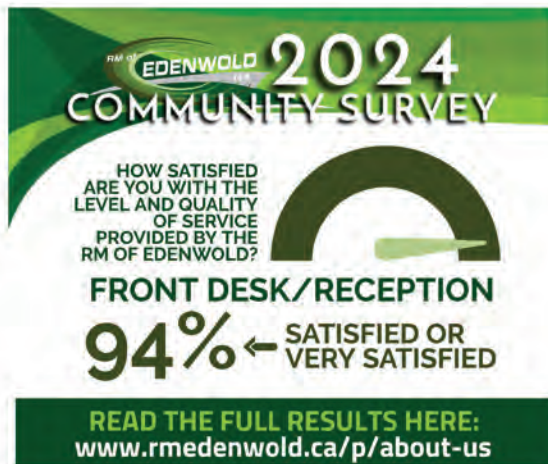
The RM leads the community-wide Frosty's Food Bank campaign and supports the Regina Shoebox event during the Christmas season.



The RM continues to facilitate the Community Garage Sale Weekend. In 2024, the event saw additional support from the Town of White City to assist with safety aspects and to improve traffic flow. The event allows ratepayers the opportunity to declutter and provides an economic opportunity for residents and local businesses.



The RM launched a geocaching activity with 12 treasures hidden around the municipality that included historical facts about the municipality. The event attracted participants from the region and around the world.

Following the general election in November, two new Councillors – Darren Bezborotko and Stephen Werner joined Council in November to support effective governance and representation within the municipality.

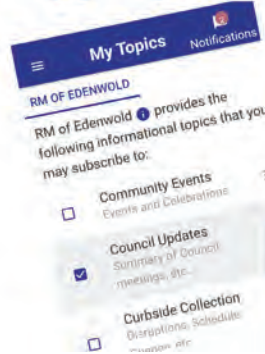


The RM continued its commitment to responsive and efficient service delivery, with 337 ratepayer service requests submitted into the RM's Service Tracker, with RM staff closing almost all of them in a timely manner.



The RM presented 24 Council Updates over the year that offered ratepayers expanded details on all Council matters. We also significantly increased public engagement through several mail-in surveys, allowing us to better understand and address the concerns of our residents.

Community Safety Officers conducted 220 traffic stops in 2024 and responded to 142 calls for service, which included bylaw complaints and provincial statute offenses.



There were 759 overweight vehicle permits issued in 2024, with all revenue generated supporting road maintenance.

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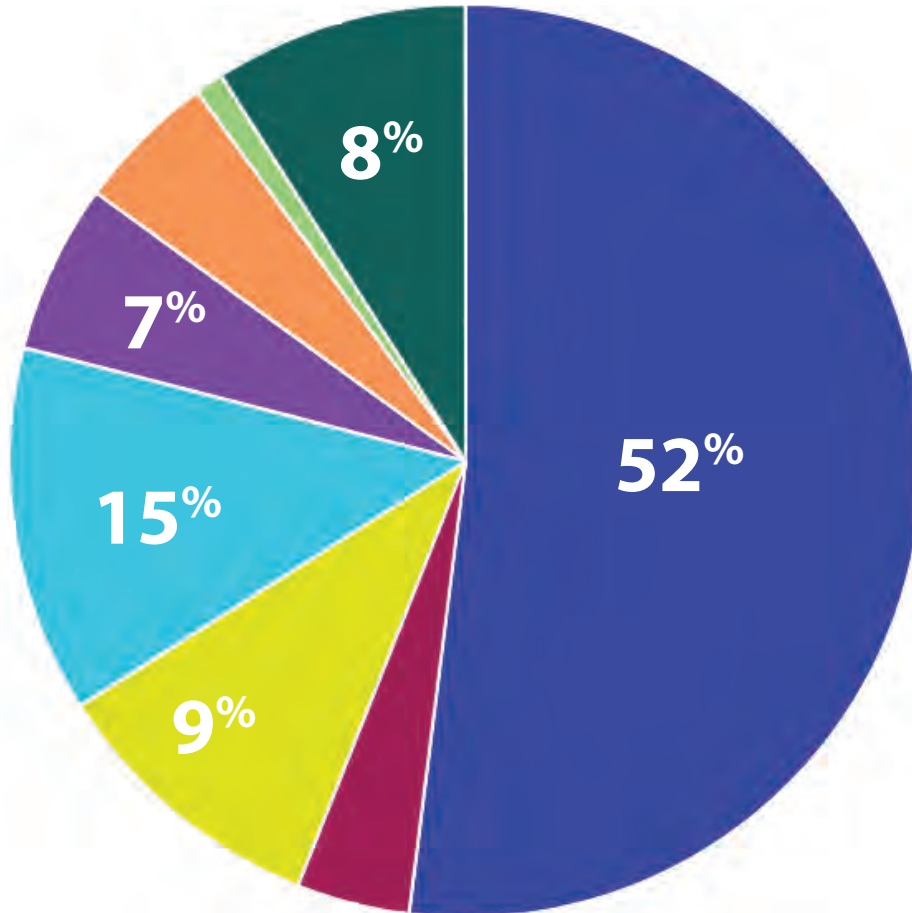

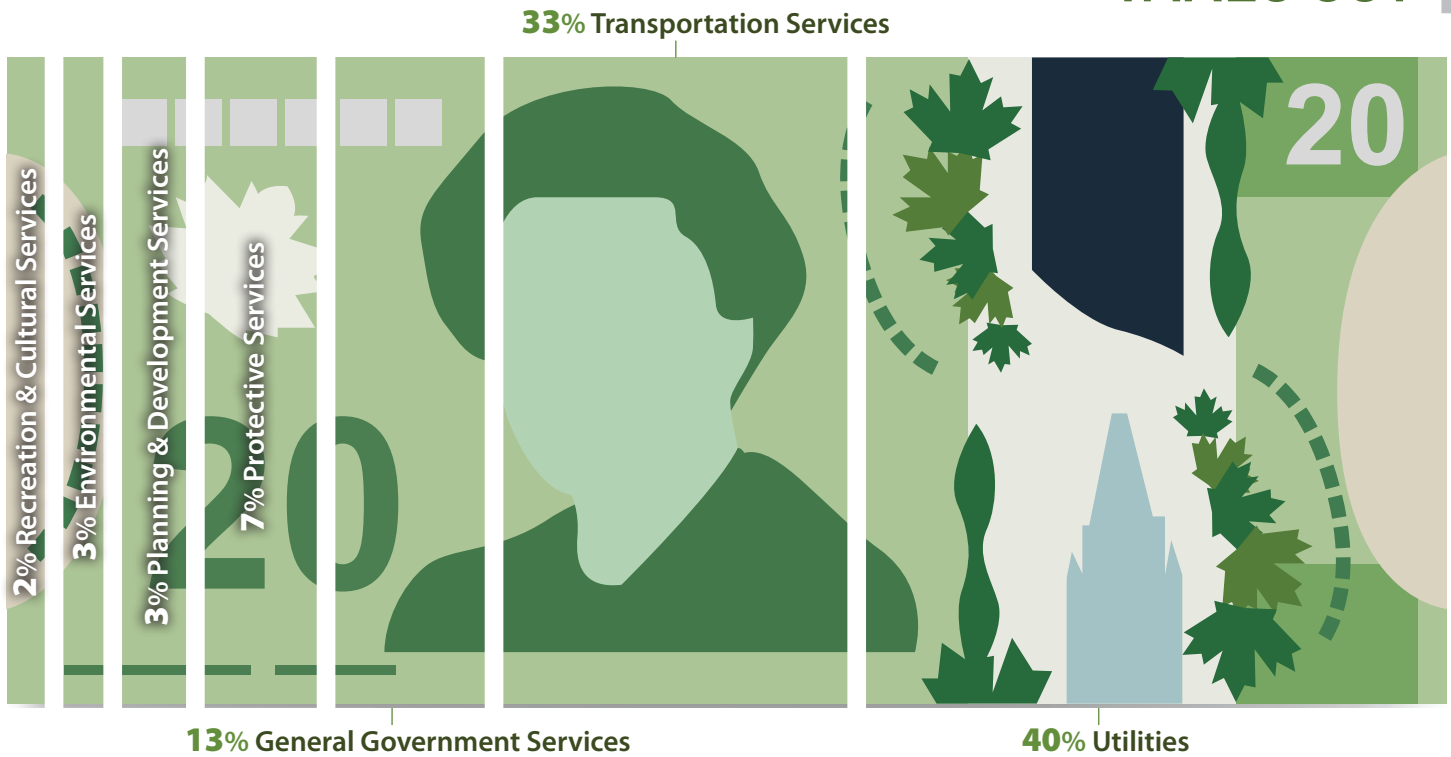
